Program: Orion Melehan, Co-founded Santa Cruz based LIFEAID, sports recovery drinks. Born and raised in Scotts Valley. UCSB grad, met his wife, then moved his family back to SV. Was a certified Financial Planner during the financial crisis. Digging himself out of a

hole at that time, he became open to new opportunities. In 2009 he started Cross-fit, with Aaron Hinde and thought there had to be a better way, a better beverage for recovery. Focused on single target market: golfers. High income, well-educated, who understand health necessity. Started with Delaveaga and then expanded to 600 golf courses and then gyms. Trainers became influencers and "reps" - Whole Foods buyer from Rocky Mountain region in CO called and wanted product. Started scaling, building sales team, opened up Walmart, Sprouts, etc. Went to Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, scaling through gyms in those countries. Great incubation/trial for the brand. About 70% of revenue comes from online, not brick and mortar. Led with this idea: Follow the laws, but break the rules.

After starting with \$60K, now has \$250M in lifetime revenue this year!
